- Sharing common interests, goals and in some cases ownership




## LoCo is a Compound Word

   "a local point of view"; "local outbreaks of flu"; "a local bus line"



## How to Strengthen a Community

Ubuntu in the truly LOCAL sense

- Get involved in local projects
- Be a resource for support locally
- Teach people how to fish"
   ... don't sell fish



## How to Strengthen a Community

**Ubuntu in the truly LOCAL sense** 

- Don't engage in projects that aren't local. (And if you do, prioritize them much lower)
- Make Ubuntu awareness a priority in your postal code
- Know your neighbourhood. Who's using Ubuntu? Who needs to?



- Attend events and meetings in person
- Participate in our local support forum (more on that shortly)
- Local projects (support days, stores, libraries, schools)



- Meet a friend or two for "Ubuntu coffee"
- Show them something really cool you do with Ubuntu
- Give them a CD (If they ask), and encouragement



- Post to our discussion board and mailing list
- Say the word Ubuntu whenever you can. People need to hear it.
- Give a demo in your building



- Poster, flyer, sticker the places you visit in your neighbourhood
- If your neighbours know more about Ubuntu, your neighbourhood will become more interesting!






